The following draft Rules which the Government of Goa proposes to make in exercise of the powers conferred by section 112 of the Factories Act, 1948 (Central Act No. 63 of 1948) so as to further amend the Goa Factories Rules, 1985, are hereby pre-published as required by section 115 of

the said Act, for information of all the persons likely to be affected thereby and notice is hereby given that the said draft Rules will be taken into consideration by the Government after the expiry of a period of forty-five days from the date of publication of this Notification in the Official Gazette.

All objections and suggestions to the said draft Rules may be forwarded to the Secretary (Factories and Boilers), Government of Goa, Secretariat, Porvorim, before the expiry of the said period of forty-five days so that they may be taken into consideration at the time of finalization of the said draft Rules.

### DRAFT RULES

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 112 of the Factories Act, 1948 (Central Act No. 63 of 1948) and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, the Government of Goa hereby makes the following rules so as to further amend the Goa Factories Rules, 1985, namely:—

1. *Short title and commencement.*— (1) These rules may be called the Goa Factories (Fifteenth Amendment) Rules, 2020.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. *Amendment of rule 2A.*— In rule 2A of the Goa Factories Rules, 1985 (hereinafter referred to as the “principal Rules”),—

(i) in sub-rule (3), for the words “ten thousand rupees”, the words “twenty thousand rupees” shall be substituted;

(ii) in the Schedule,—

(a) against serial number 1, in column 5, the following expression shall be inserted, namely:—

“Instruments such as Digital Rebound Hammer, Ultrasonic Thickness Gauge, Ultrasonic Pulse Velocity Meter, Half Cell Potentiometer, Rebar Locator, Dye Penetration Test Kit

and any other equipment or device as may be recommended by the Chief Inspector to determine the safety of the building/shed/structure/work of engineering construction.”;

(b) against serial number 3, in column 5, for the existing entry, the following entry shall be substituted, namely:—

“Instruments such as Vernier Calliper, Level Gauges, Ultrasonic Thickness Gauge with normal and hot probe, Tensometer/Spring Balancer and any other equipment or device as may be recommended by the Chief Inspector to determine the safe working condition of the Hoists and Lifts.”;

(c) against serial number 4, in column 5, for the existing entry, the following entry shall be substituted, namely:—

“Instruments such as Vernier Calliper, Level Gauges, Ultrasonic Thickness Gauge with normal and hot probe, Tensometer/Spring Balancer and any other equipment or device as may be recommended by the Chief Inspector to determine the safe working condition of the Lifting Machinery and Lifting Tackles.”;

(d) against serial number 5, in column 5, for the existing entry, the following entry shall be substituted, namely:—

“Instruments such as Vernier Calliper, Level Gauges, Ultrasonic Thickness Gauge with normal and hot probe, calibrated pressure gauges, hydraulic pump and any other equipment or device as may be recommended by the Chief Inspector to determine the safety in the use of pressure plant.”;

(e) against serial number 7, in column 5, for the existing entry, the following entry shall be substituted, namely:—

(f) “Instruments such as Stack Velocity Meter, Anemometer, Manometer, Pitot Tube and any other equipment or device as may be recommended by the Chief Inspector to determine the efficiency and effectiveness of the system or the appliance.”;

3. *Amendment of rule 3.*— In rule 3 of the principal Rules, in sub-rule (1),—

(i) for clause (d), the following clause shall be substituted, namely:—

“(d) Where any flammable or non-flammable or toxic or non-toxic compressed gas or petroleum product or any other inflammable substance is intended to be possessed in a cylinder or a vessel or a tank in any factory, application for permission shall also be accompanied by an approval/license, if applicable, as required under the Gas Cylinders Rules, 2016 or the Static and Mobile Pressure Vessels (Unfired) Rules, 2016 or the Petroleum Rules, 2002 or the Inflammable Substances Act, 1952 (Act No. 20 of 1952), as the case may be, as amended from time to time, from the authority concerned.”;

(ii) in clause (e),—

(a) for the expression “one thousand rupees”, the expression “two thousand rupees” shall be substituted;

(b) the following explanation shall be inserted, namely:—

“*Explanation:* In respect of application made through online mode, fees shall be paid through e-challan payment gateway.”.

4. *Amendment of rule 4.*— In rule 4 of the principal Rules, in the Explanation after clause (c), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:—

“(d) existing building/shed/structure/work of engineering construction is in

accordance with the plans approved by the Chief Inspector.”.

5. *Amendment of rule 5.*— In rule 5 of the principal Rules, after the existing proviso, the following proviso shall be inserted, namely:—

“Provided further that no manufacturing process(es) shall be carried out in any building/shed/structure which consist of any type of lifting tools or lifting machines mounted on it for the purpose of lifting and /or movement of load, unless a Certificate of Stability is obtained from the competent person for the said building/shed/structure. Before issuing such Certificate of Stability, the competent person shall conduct thorough structural analysis so as to ascertain load bearing capacity by taking into account the safe working load to be lifted and/or moved. Fresh Certificate of Stability shall be obtained from the competent person in case there is any addition or modification to lifting tools or lifting machines so mounted.”.

6. *Insertion of new rule 5A.*— After rule 5 of the principal Rules, the following rule shall be inserted, namely:—

“5A. *Procedure for issue of Certificate of Stability.*— Competent person shall follow the following procedure for issuing Certificate of Stability under rule 5, namely:—

(a) *Scrutiny of approved drawing:*— The competent person shall verify the plan approved by the Chief Inspector to ascertain existing building/shed/structure/work of engineering construction is in accordance with the approved plan.

(b) *Inspection of structure:*— (i) Building inspection from functional point of view i.e. staircase, walls, columns, beams, roofing, floors and ceilings.

(ii) Visual inspection of structural elements as per the checklist specified in Table below for detection of visual

defects, if any, and assessment of defects for probable cause.

(c) *Non-destructive testing:*— (i) Concrete members – Non-destructive test for Assessment of concrete strength by Digital Rebound Hammer and Quality of concrete by ultrasonic test, at about 4 critical locations, per building (as a minimum requirement), or more, if need be and probability of corrosion of reinforcement in concrete at a few selected locations by half cell potential method.

(ii) *Steel members.*— Thickness of steel structures by Ultrasonic Thickness Gauge at critical locations and dye penetration test to check integrity of weld joints, if felt necessary.”.

7. *Amendment of rule 6.*— In rule 6 of the principal Rules, for sub-rule (2), the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:—

“(2) Every such application shall be accompanied by a treasury receipt or an invoice for book adjustment, as the case may be, for payment of the fees prescribed for the purpose as specified in the Schedule below:—

8. *Amendment of rule 9.*— In rule 9 of the principal Rules,

(i) in sub-rule (1), after the expression “on which the license is due to expire”, the expression “and in respect of application made through online mode, fees shall be paid through e-challan payment gateway” shall be inserted;

(ii) in sub-rule (2), in second proviso, after the expression “Schedule attached to rule 6”, the expression “and in case during the period of validity of the license, there is an increase in the fees payable, the Occupier, within a period of three months from the date of publication of Notification to that effect in the Official Gazette, shall pay the difference in fees payable with effect from the date of such increase till the remainder period of validity of license.” shall be inserted.

9. *Amendment of rule 13.*— In rule 13 of the principal Rules, in sub-rule (1),—

(a) before the proviso, the following expression shall be added at the end, namely:—

“In respect of application made through online mode, appropriate amount of fee shall be paid through e-challan payment gateway under the said head of account.”.

(b) in the proviso, the following expression shall be added at the end, namely:—

“In respect of application made through online mode, appropriate amount of fee shall be paid through e-challan payment gateway under the said head of account.”.

10. *Substitution of rule 19A.*— For rule 19A of the principal Rules, the following rule shall be substituted, namely,—

“19A. *Medical Examination of workers.*—

(1) Save as otherwise provided in these Rules, the workers in a factory shall be medically examined once before employment and thereafter every three years by the Certifying Surgeon appointed under the Act or the Medical Inspector of Factories appointed by the Government or the Factory Medical Officer or the Occupational Health Laboratory recognized under sub-rule (3) of rule 90 O or sub-rule (4) of rule 90 O.

(2) Tests/investigations to be conducted for the purpose of carrying out medical examination of a worker before employment and thereafter at specified intervals shall consist of blood investigations for hemoglobin, total WBC count, differential count, blood grouping, fasting blood sugar level, serum creatinine, blood urea, electro cardio gram, urine (routine and microscopic), audiometry, X-ray chest, eye test including colour vision, pulmonary function test and any other test(s) which the Certifying Surgeon appointed under the Act or the Medical Inspector of Factories appointed by the Government or the Factory Medical Officer or the Occupational Health Laboratory may specify.”.

11. *Amendment of rule 47.*— In rule 47 of the principal Rules, after clause (b), the following clauses shall be inserted, namely,—

“(c) Sanitary Napkins of adequate quantity conforming to Indian Standards shall be provided and maintained in the women’s toilets for their use, and the same be replenished periodically, as and when required.

(d) Disposable bins with lids shall be provided in the women’s toilets for the collection of the used napkins. The used napkins shall be disposed off daily as per the procedure approved by the Inspector or in accordance with any other law in force.”.

12. *Amendment of rule 68.*— In rule 68 of the principal Rules, in sub-rule (4), for clause (b), the following clause shall be substituted, namely:—

“(b) a suitable pressure gauge with a dial range not less than 1.5 times and not exceeding twice the maximum safe working pressure, easily visible and designed to show, at all times, the correct internal pressure in kilograms per square centimetre and marked with a prominent red mark at the maximum safe working pressure of the pressure vessels or pressure plant and the same shall be mounted at a height not more than 1.5 metres from the working level;”.

13. *Amendment of rule 90N.*— In rule 90N of the principal Rules, in sub-rule (1), after clause (b), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:—

“(bb) The tests/investigations to be conducted for the purpose of carrying out medical examination of a worker before employment and thereafter at prescribed intervals shall consist of blood investigations for hemoglobin, total WBC count, differential count, blood grouping, fasting blood sugar level, serum creatinine, blood urea, electro cardio gram, urine (routine and microscopic), audiometry, X-ray chest, eye test including colour vision, pulmonary function test and other test(s) which the Factory Medical Officer or the Occupational Health Laboratory may specify;”.

14. *Amendment of rule 90-O.*— In rule 90-O of the principal Rules,—

(i) in sub-rule (4),—

(a) in clause (a), for the words “ten thousand rupees”, the words “twenty thousand rupees” shall be substituted;

(b) for clause (b), the following clause shall be substituted, namely:—

“(b) The institution shall employ persons possessing the qualifications specified in sub-rule (2) and shall possess license/approval/permission from authorities such as Local

Authority, Goa State Pollution Control Board, Directorate of Health Services and shall have facilities and equipments at the disposal as set out hereinbelow.”.

15. *Substitution of rule 90S.*— For rule 90S of the principal Rules, the following rule shall be substituted, namely:—

“90S. *Qualifications, etc., of supervisors.*— (1) all persons who are required to supervise the handling of hazardous substances shall possess the following qualifications and experience:—

(a) (i) a degree in any branch of engineering or technology or a masters degree in Science (Physics or Chemistry) or a masters degree in Pharmacy, from recognized institution, with two years of experience of working in a factory involved in hazardous process; or

(ii) a degree in Science (Physics or Chemistry) or a degree in Pharmacy or a diploma in any branch of engineering or technology, from a recognized institution, with five years of experience of working in a factory involved in hazardous process;

(b) The Chief Inspector may direct the Occupier of the factory involved in hazardous process to require the supervisor(s) so appointed in the factory to undergo a certificate course in Health and Safety of the duration as may be specified;

(2) The syllabus, course fees, duration, mode of examination, other aspects of the above course and the organisations conducting the course shall be approved by the Director General Factory Advice Service and Labour Institutes or the State Government from time to time.”.

16. *Insertion of new rule 90X.*— After rule 90W of the principal Rules, the following rule shall be inserted, namely:—

“90X. *Personal Protective Equipments.*— (1) All workers shall be mandatorily

provided with Personal Protective Equipments (PPEs) as required under any of the provisions of the Act or the Rules and such PPEs shall conform to the relevant National Standard. The occupiers shall require the worker to use such PPEs and the same shall be maintained in proper working conditions by the occupier. No charges whatsoever shall be charged by the occupier from the workers for provision of such PPEs.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of the provisions of sub-rule (1), the various types of PPEs to which this rule shall extend for use in factories shall be as specified hereinbelow.

(i) *Safety Helmet:*— All workers who are likely to be exposed to any hazard which may cause head injury shall be provided with safety helmets conforming to relevant National Standards. All the workers shall be adequately trained on proper use of such PPEs. When work at height is being carried out such safety helmets shall be provided with a nape strap. No safety helmet which has resisted an impact shall be reused. Periodic cleaning and visual inspection to check any deformation in size or shape shall be carried out.

(ii) *Protective Footwear:*— Protective footwear shall be provided to them for preventing materials being dropped on their feet or nail or other sharp objects penetrating their sole. The type and nature of foot wear to be used at workplaces shall be decided by the occupier based on nature of work being carried at such work places. Proper disinfection shall be carried out to prevent contagious fungal infection of the skin that causes scaling, flaking, and itching of the affected areas. Proper medical care shall be provided to prevent workers from suffering from ingrown nails, metatarsalgia, heel spur, hammer toes and nerve damage after wearing safety shoe.

(iii) *Safety Goggles and Spectacles*:— The relevant National Standard shall be applicable for eye-protection intended for use in industrial undertakings to provide protection for the eyes of the workers against hazards such as flying particles and fragments, splashing materials, molten metal's and harmful dust, gases or vapors, aerosols and radiations which are likely to impair vision or damage the eyes. Additional eye protection over their prescription lenses shall be used ensuring that the protective eyewear does not disturb the proper positioning of the prescription lenses.

(iv) *Equipment for eye and face protection during welding*:— Relevant National Standard shall be followed for the requirements of goggles, hand shield and helmet intended to protect an operator above the shoulder from harmful radiation, spark and particles of hot metal during welding, cutting and similar operations employing a gas flame or electric arc.

(v) *Gloves and Protective Clothing*:— Suitable gloves, leather gauntlets and mittens conforming to relevant National Standard shall be used for protection of hand of the workers from getting injured. Such protective gloves shall be provided where the hands are exposed to hazards such as those from skin absorption of harmful substances; severe cuts or lacerations; severe abrasion; punctures; chemical burns; thermal burns; and harmful temperature extremes.

Suitable protective clothing as per relevant National Standard available for apron (Rubberized, acid and alkali resistant) shall be used for protection of workers who are likely to be exposed to any hazard which may cause injury to their skin.

(vi) *Ear protection when exposed to noise*:— Protection against the effects of noise exposure shall be provided when the sound levels exceed the prescribed

standards. The relevant National Standard shall be followed while selection of suitable ear protection. Periodic disinfection of reusable ear protectors shall be carried out to eliminate hearing loss caused by infection, discharge, pain, etc. in the ear.

(vii) *Respiratory Protection*:— Respiratory Protective equipment based on the nature of hazard as per the relevant National Standard shall be provided by the occupier of the factory to the workers for their respiratory protection against dust, fumes, gases, particulates, etc. Clinical Examination and appropriate medical tests shall be undertaken to avoid irritant Dermatitis, nose bridge sores, etc. because of prolong use of respiratory personal protective equipment.

(viii) *Other Protective Equipment*:— Appropriate personal protective equipment based on the nature of hazards as per the relevant National Standard shall be provided by the occupier to the workers. These shall include the following:—

(a) Safety harnesses with independently secured lifelines where protection against falls cannot be provided by other appropriate means.

(b) Life vests and life preservers where there is a danger of falling into water.

(c) Distinguishing clothing or reflective devices or otherwise conspicuously visible material when there is regular exposure to danger from moving vehicles.

(3) The Inspector may, having regard to the nature of the hazards involved in work and process being carried out, order the occupier or the manager in writing to supply to the workers exposed to particular hazard any personal protective equipment conforming to Relevant National Standards as may be found necessary.”.



17. *Amendment of rule 131.*— In rule 131 of the principal Rules, after sub-rule (6), the following sub-rule shall be inserted, namely:—

“(7) Other tests/investigations to be conducted for the purpose of carrying out medical examination of a worker before employment and thereafter at specified intervals shall consist of blood investigations for hemoglobin, total WBC count, differential count, blood grouping, fasting blood sugar level, serum creatinine, blood urea, electro cardio gram, urine (routine and microscopic), audiometry, X-ray chest, eye test including colour vision, pulmonary function test and any other test(s) which the Certifying Surgeon may specify.”.

In exercise of the powers conferred under sub-rule (3) of Rule 4 of the Goa Stamp (Determination of True Market Value of Property) Rules, 2003, the Government of Goa is pleased to issue statement of minimum Land Rates as follows for the year 2020-21 which shall come into effect from 17th August, 2020 to 31st March, 2021.

- In land acquisition matters, these land values will be only broad guiding factor in the exercise of determining the compensation to be paid by the Land Acquisition Officer. The land values should not be made ipso facto applicable.

- ❖ In S3 zone and area upto 1,000 sq.mts., the rates will be 20% less than the base value.
- ❖ In S3 and area 1001 – 4000 sq.mts., 25% less than the base value.
- ❖ In S3 and area 4001 – 10,000 sq.mts., 30% less than the base value.
- ❖ In S3 and area 10,001 – 50,000 sq.mts., 40% less than the base value.
- ❖ In S3 and area above 50,000 sq.mts., 45% less than the base value.

## S4 Zone

- ❖ In S4 zone and area upto 1,000 sq.mts., the rates will be 25% less than the base value.
- ❖ In S4 and area 1001 – 4000 sq.mts., 30% less than the base value.
- ❖ In S4 and area 4001 – 10,000 sq.mts., 35% less than the base value.
- ❖ In S4 and area 10,001 – 50,000 sq.mts., 45% less than the base value.
- ❖ In S4 and area above 50,000 sq.mts., 50% less than the base value.

## C1 Zone

- ❖ In C1 zone and area upto 1,000 sq.mts., the rates will be 100% more than the base value.

- ❖ In C1 and area 1001 – 4000 sq.mts., 90% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C1 and area 4001 – 10,000 sq.mts., 80% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C1 and area 10,001 – 50,000 sq.mts., 60% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C1 and area above 50,000 sq.mts., 50% more than the base value.

## C2 Zone

- ❖ In C2 zone and area upto 1,000 sq.mts., the rates will be 75% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C2 and area 1001 – 4000 sq.mts., 65% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C2 and area 4001 – 10,000 sq.mts., 55% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C2 and area 10,001 – 50,000 sq.mts., 35% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C2 and area above 50,000 sq.mts., 25% more than the base value.

## C3 Zone

- ❖ In C3 zone and area upto 1,000 sq.mts., the rates will be 50% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C3 and area 1001 – 4000 sq.mts., 40% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C3 and area 4001 – 10,000 sq.mts., 30% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C3 and area 10,001 – 50,000 sq.mts., 20% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C3 and area above 50,000 sq.mts., 10% more than the base value.

## C4 Zone

- ❖ In C4 zone and area upto 1,000 sq.mts., the rates will be 25% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C4 and area 1001 – 4000 sq.mts., 20% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C4 and area 4001 – 10,000 sq.mts., 15% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C4 and area 10,001 – 50,000 sq.mts., 10% more than the base value.
- ❖ In C4 and area above 50,000 sq.mts., 5% more than the base value.

## I Zone (Industrial/Institutional)

- ❖ In all Industrial/Institutional/Public/Semi-Public areas upto 10,000 sq.mts., the rates will be 40% less than the base value.
- ❖ In I and area 1001 – 4,000 sq.mts., 45% less than the base value.

- ❖ In I and area 4001 – 10,000 sq.mts. 50% less than the base value.
- ❖ In I and area 10,001 – 50,000 sq.mts. 55% less than the base value.
- ❖ In I and area above 50,000 sq.mts., 60% less than base value.

## O/F Zone (Orchard/Forest)

- ❖ In orchard and forest land upto 1,000 sq.mts., 50% less than base value.
- ❖ In O/F and area 1001 – 4000 sq.mts., 55% less than base value.
- ❖ In O/F and area 4001 – 10,000 sq.mts. 60% less than base value.
- ❖ In O/F and area 10,001 – 50,000 sq.mts. 65% less than base value.
- ❖ In O/F and area above 50,000 sq.mts., 70% less than base value.

## A – Zone (Agricultural)

- ❖ In Agricultural land upto 1,000 sq.mts., 60% less than base value.
- ❖ In A and area 1001 – 4000 sq.mts., 65% less than base value.
- ❖ In A and area 4001 – 10,000 sq.mts. 70% less than the base value.
- ❖ In A and area 10,001 – 50,000 sq.mts. 75% less than the base value.
- ❖ In A and area above 50,000 sq.mts., 80% less than base value.

## BW Zone (Barren Waste)

- ❖ In Barren Waste land upto 1,000 sq.mts., 70% less than base value.
- ❖ In BW and area 1001 – 4000 sq.mts., 75% less than base value.
- ❖ In BW and area 4001 – 10,000 sq.mts. 80% less than the base value.
- ❖ In BW and area 10,001 – 50,000 sq.mts. 85% less than the base value.
- ❖ In BW and area above 50,000 sq.mts., 90% less than base value.

## NOTE

- ❖ Barren waste land is not categorized as a zone in the Regional Plan or ODP. As a proof, certificate from the Taluka Mamlatdar is to be obtained that the land is barren and waste land not fit for cultivation. In any zone, if more than 50% of the land under consideration is found to be rocky/marshy or uncultivable due to natural conditions, the whole of such land is to be categorized as barren waste land.

- ❖ Where in places there is no commercial zoning or where in settlement zone there is no grading of zones 1, 2, 3 & 4, S3 rates would be applicable in the Talukas of Bicholim, Pernem and Quepem, S4 rates would be applicable in the Talukas of Satari, Sanguem and Canacona and S2 rates would be applicable in the Talukas of Tiswadi, Bardez, Salcete, Mormugao and Ponda.

- ❖ A copy of the Regional Plan and ODP would be available in every Talukas Sub-Registrar Office for ready reference.

- ❖ No land value shall be below Rs. 20/- per sq.mts.

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### Notification

Whereas, the draft Rules, namely, the Goa Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Rules, 2020 which the Government of Goa proposed to make in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 26, 28, 38, 65, 95, 96, 107, 111, 138, 159, 176 and 213 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 (Central Act 59 of 1988)(hereinafter referred to as the "said Act") so as to further amend the Goa Motor Vehicles Rules, 1991 were published as required by section 212 of the said Act vide Notification No. D.Tpt/STA/2375/Part File/2019/1399 dated 17-06-2020, of the Directorate of Transport, Panaji in the Official Gazette, Series I No. 12 dated 18-06-2020, inviting objections and suggestion from all persons likely to be affected thereby within fifteen days from the date of publication of the said Notification in the Official Gazette.

And whereas, the said Official Gazette was made available to the public on 18-06-2020.

And whereas, no objections and suggestions have been received from the public on the said Draft Rules by the Government, within the stipulated period.

Now therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 26, 28, 38, 65, 95, 96,

107, 111, 138, 159, 176 and 213 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 (Central Act 59 of 1988) and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, the Government of Goa hereby makes the following rules, so as to further amend the Goa Motor Vehicles Rules, 1991 namely:—

1. *Short title and commencement.*— (1) These Rules may be called the Goa Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Rules, 2020.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. *Amendment of rule 92.*— In rule 92 of the Goa Motor Vehicles Rules, 1991,—

(i) in sub-rule (1), for the expression “Regional Transport Authority”, the expression “Regional Transport Authority or State Transport Authority” shall be substituted;

(ii) for sub-rule (2), the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:—

“(2) On receipt of an application under sub-rule (1), the State Transport

Authority or Regional Transport Authority, as the case may be, may require the transferor and the transferee or their duly authorized representatives to remain present before the Assistant Director of Transport (HQ) in case of State Transport Authority and Assistant Director of Transport of respective sub offices in Taluka, in case of Regional Transport Authority, to prove their identity and append their respective signatures”;

(iii) in sub-rules (3), (4) and (5), for the expression “Regional Transport Authority”, wherever it occurs, the expression “Regional Transport Authority or State Transport Authority”, as the case may be” shall be substituted.
